STEPHEN A. COLLINS PUBLIC SERVICE AWARD

A story or stories that have had significant impact in the public interest.

The judges said:

"This well-researched and compassionately sourced series not only uncovered a current problem, but projected ahead a catastrophic future problem that will no doubt touch every person in the state. This reporting has done the public the great service of addressing the crisis of elder care before it's too late."

THEODORE DRISCOLL AWARD FOR INVESTIGATIVE REPORTING

A single story or series containing information, obtained through reporting initiative, not readily available to the news media or public.

"This series emerged from a deep pool of investigative stories. This series employs a wide range of public records to tell a story of a dysfunctional and problematic health care system. FIRST AMENDMENT AWARD

A single story or series which increases the public understanding of the role of the press in a free society.

"This thorough look at Bridgeport's long record of flouting FOI requirements led to both an overdue strengthening of state law and an immediate promise by the city to improve its practices. The response to this well-researched investigation shows the power of the press to be an agent of change and keep government open and accountable to its citizens. Excellent work."
